Inter-school sporting principles

The WSSA recognise the demands on schools to provide opportunities for children to attend events which reflect a realistic and appropriate balance between participation, competition and development. 

YEAR 4

Macaws class shared their rainforest topic with their parents and carers this week. Using their topic enquiry question, "Why would it matter if the rainforests disappeared?" they shared what they had learnt including about the climate of the rainforests, the unique habitats found there and the current threats to both the natural world and the local tribes that live there. YEAR 5

Year 5 have enjoyed experimenting with different techniques to depict an image of the Moon. They used different media such as water colour, pastel, pen and ink, collage and pencil shading. They then chose their preferred medium to create their final piece, which included their own silhouette.



YEAR 6

Year 6 have been busy in the kitchen, creating authentic Second World War recipes. We cooked some lovely meals of Homity pie, potato scones and vegetable turnovers- all recipes that would have been popular in times of rationing. The children had to combine many cooking skills including: weighing, peeling, chopping and using the hobs and ovens safely.



A group of 16 of our year 6 children supported the students of St Andrew's High School last week in their school production of Matilda Jr. These children took up this opportunity back in December and have been rehearsing alongside the St Andrew's students since then. It was fantastic to see them up on the big stage, singing and dancing so enthusiastically, in front of packed crowds and our children really loved the experience.





SPORTS REPORT

The indoor athletics season was the main feature of the first half of Spring Term with over 60 children from across the whole school taking part in the different competitions. The format of all the competitions was very similar with children competing in various relay running races and events including speed bounce, long jump, triple jump, 5 strides, vertical jump, basketball throw, shuttlecock throw and javelin.
