YEAR R

We finished off an incredible term with an Easter breakfast. Mr Cooper read us a blessing before we ate cereal, hot cross buns and bread. Mr Cooper then re-told us the Easter story, showing us why hot cross buns look the way they do. What a lovely way to end the term.





YEAR I

A great day out at Amberley Museum last week. Year 1 rode on a narrow-gauge railway, an old Southdown bus and built their own wagon-wheel. The sun shone and we had a great time learning from the objects and artefacts.







Year Two have been making Great Fire of London houses! We used many skills including measuring, sawing, cutting, constructing and problem solving. What a great day!



YEAR 3

Year 3 had a fantastic day at their Robot workshop. They explored lots of different CAMs and learnt how they work. They then built their own toy robot and decorated it with lots of craft materials. Everyone had a brilliant day!







As part of Year 3's Marvellous Moving Machines topic, they have learnt all about pasta machines and how they have changed overtime. They then made their own pasta using the machine, thinking about how to shape it and how many times to roll it through to get the perfect pasta! Everyone had a brilliant time!







This week, Year 4 had an amazing time creating their own rainforest houses in DT. Using an assortment of "natural" resources, they planned, designed and built their houses in teams, thinking about what they had learnt about how people live in the rainforest. Their teachers were amazed at their creativity, problem solving and perseverance when faced with challenges. We all had a really fantastic time. Thank you to the wonderful parents who helped on the day!



Year 5 have been learning all about space! In science, the children jumped and placed post-it notes on the wall. Then, using a mathematical equation, they calculated how high they could jump on different planets (which have different levels of gravity) and presented this information in a graph.



Eight children from Year 5 were invited to go to a Choral Day at Christ Hospital School. While we were there, we learnt four new songs, watched the marching band and then performed the songs we had learnt to an audience. It was a great day.





Year 6 have been busy sewing: making textile teddy bears suitable for an evacuee child. We designed them, used templates to cut out the fabric and then used a range of stiches to sew the bears together. Don't they look brilliant!





We finished our World War Two topic, 'When the siren sounds', this week with a VE-Day-style celebration with parents. It was lovely for parents to share the children's topic work from the term. The children entertained us with their wartime 1940's-style dances too.
