We believe that PE and sport plays a vital role in the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of children.

Broadwater places a high emphasis on being inclusive and providing opportunities for all children of all abilities. On a calendar of fixtures in 2022-23, 67.3% of children represented the school in inter-school competitions.

## Swimming

Swimming is a national curriculum requirement and by the end of key stage 2 pupils are expected to be able to swim confidently and know how to be safe in and around water. The 3 national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety are to:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- perform a safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
- use a range of strokes effectively

Schools are required to publish information on the percentage of their pupils in year 6 who met each of the 3 swimming and water safety national curriculum requirements.
